Editorial...

The Pharisees plotted how they could get Jesus into a corner and counteract His growing influence and popularity amongst the people. Matthew chapter 22 reveals an amazing conversation between Jesus and His accusers. We read: "Then the Pharisees went and plotted how they might entangle Him in His talk. And they sent to Him their disciples with the Herodians, saying, "Teacher, we know that You are true, and teach the way of God in truth; nor do You care about anyone, for You do not regard the person of men. "Tell us, therefore, what do You think? Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, "Why do you test Me, you hypocrites? "Show Me the tax money." So they brought Him a denarius. And He said to them, "Whose image and inscription is this?" They said to Him, "Caesar's." And He said to them, "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." When they had heard these words, they marveled, and left Him and went their way." (Matt 22:15-22).

The man asking the question was not honest in his pursuit for knowledge of the truth. Thinking he could corner Jesus he was met with a profound answer that made him leave quickly. The conversation is abruptly ended with the pointed words of Jesus echoing in the ears of his listeners; "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." This just begs for a follow up question! "What things belong to God?" Jesus made it plain that the coin belonged to Caesar because it bore his image and inscription. Logically, then, that which belongs to God bears His image and inscription. God said in the beginning; "Let us make man in our image, according to Our likeness." (Gen 1:26). So what belongs to God? You and me! Our lives are His for He has created us. We belong to Him! The coin paid as tax money to Caesar glorified Caesar and his earthly Empire. When we give ourselves to God it is to glorify Him and forward His eternal kingdom!

A team of four young people joined us – Jechiel, Giovanni, David and Samuel – all excited to experience their first encounter with a third world country.

The first week we spent in Nairobi. We had been asked to lead out in a week of prayer for the youth of Nairobi Central Church. We saw this as a leading of the Lord and a great privilege. At the same time we realized the responsibility as this church is like the heart of the Advent movement in East Africa, and the impulses coming from this church has a widespread influence.

We are convinced that the Spirit was at work. These daily revival meetings were a true blessing both for us and the local youth attending. During the first week we also had the opportunity to have different programs at schools and even two of the



largest Universities of Nairobi. We praise the Lord for this unique opportunity to come in contact with a promising group of youth, which will be instrumental in forming the future of the country.

In the mornings I also held a medical missionary course for interested lay-workers. I really enjoyed these classes. The group was small and personal, and of good quality – eager souls with intention of putting into practise what they learned.

We spent two Sabbaths in Nairobi. Daniel had the divine service in Nairobi Central



and New Life Church, where we were camp-meeting speakers in 2006 and 2007. We were happy to be back among brothers and sisters in the Lord, even though it was hard to recognize the members since the numbers are in the thousands in contrast to Europe.

From Nairobi we continued westward, this time to new and unknown fields close to the border of Tanzania. Countless impressions met our senses as we passed small villages, marketplaces and fascinating nature and animal life. After a long and weary travel along bumpy and dusty roads, we eventually reached Migori.

"The 2011 mission trip to Kenya has been one of the most life changing experiences in my life. Kenya is a country of extreme contrasts; beautiful nature and dirty cities, cell phones and open air butchers, rich and poor living next door, pagan religion and sincere Christianity. On our trip we were emerged in the life of Kenya, we did not stay at one of the fancy resorts on a safe distance of the real Kenya but ate and stayed with the common people, this gave us a unique view of life in this special country.

One of the things that I respect most about the Christians in Kenya is the happiness they carry with them, people are always smiling and willing to help. I praise God for the privilege

The experiences from Migori won't easily be erased from our memory. The next two weeks offered a real taste of the life on the mission field. We divided the team into three, and each day three parallel meeting-series were running, focussing on children, health and Bible prophecy. These were some eventful days, filled with challenges and blessings. When you read a mission report in text and pictures, it appears exciting and even idyllic. The reality can be hard at times. You feel your dependence upon God. Especially towards the end of our stay it became clear to us that we actually were in quite corrupt surroundings. One of our drivers was brutally murdered while he was out during the night. In Heaven we will fully understand the extent of the words of the Psalmist: *"For He shall give His angels charge over you, to keep you in all your ways."* (Ps. 91:11)

The closing Sabbath we witnessed 98 precious souls entering into covenant with their Lord in the waters of baptism. By God's grace and your faithful support we were able to equip them and several others with Bibles and other materials, in order for them to grow in the knowledge of Jesus and His truth.

In the mornings we also had classes in health and Bible work, as we saw the need of faithful key workers who would be equipped to follow up and nourish the new believers.

"The mission trip to Kenya was for me a real blessing. It was an experience for a life time. While doing missionary work in Kenya I was able to put into practice what I had learned at the European bible school. I experienced how it is to give bible, health and children presentations in a country where the culture differs from my own country. Tragedy & revival - side by side

As evening arrived on the 22nd of February we landed in Melbourne city in the south of Australia. We were on our way to New Zealand and planned to fly on the next day. Christchurch, the largest city on the south Island of New Zealand, was our destination. But then we heard the shocking news! An earthquake with the magnitude of 6,3 had hit Christchurch plunging the city into devastation!

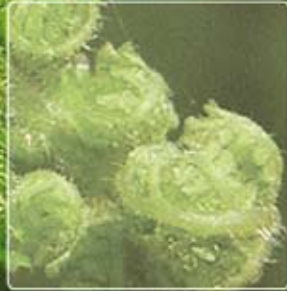

It was hard to sleep that night with many thoughts running through my mind. Our prayers went up for the people still trapped inside collapsed buildings. We were on our way to Christchurch to continue a Bible prophecy series that had already started with another speaker and I began wondering how different things would be now.

Several weeks prior to the earthquake, David Asscherick, an international speaker from the USA, had begun preaching powerful presentations on the prophecies of God's Word. The meetings had gained a tremendous momentum! This earth-shaking event on the 22nd of February occurred right in the middle of this mind-shaking event as exciting, fascinating, and intriguing Bible prophecies were being presented to hundreds of people in a large auditorium in Christchurch. Lives had been impacted by the truths of Scripture and people were seeing that the Word of God is to be our foundation in life. Then suddenly in a very real sense the foundation of this earth moved causing destruction, disaster, and death. While some turned away from God or even blamed Him for what happened others sought after Him and determined to know what Scripture tells us about the times we are living in and what place God has in these kinds of tragic moments. What an opportunity to share about God's love and His ultimate plan for humanity!

We arrived in New Zealand on the 23rd of February, a day after the tragedy. Many people were just coming to grips with what had happened to their beautiful city. The auditorium where the prophecy meetings had been held was taken over by the civil defence and used as a base for the rescue workers. Our meetings were cancelled for an indefinite time and we were not even sure if the venue would be available again in the near future. We knew the people in Christchurch needed all the physical help they could get, but we also knew that the Bible could answer a lot of the questions people had during this time of tragedy and uncertainty. The outreach team of Ilam SDA church, which had organized the meetings, had not lost their vision for the city! The following Sabbath, only days after the disaster, the church was packed. The message presented focused on the times in which we are living and how we can understand these events in the light of a Biblical worldview offering hope.

The public meetings were rescheduled and recommenced on the 15th of March. We were thankful that we were able to secure the same venue. Instead of continuing the prophecy seminar where he left off, David Asscherick had two presentations specifically targeting the situation of the city and an-



swering questions related to the earthquake. Questions like: How does God see all of this? How can I have peace in chaotic times? Can good come out of something so bad? Does the Bible have anything to say about what has happened? The presentations were a journey of reflection and discovery providing answers and hope from the Word of God. These relevant presentations were followed up by the prophecy series that had already begun before the earthquake. David decided to stay in New Zealand a little longer than planned. The meetings along with personal Bible studies led to a beautiful baptism ceremony on March the 26th. 9 people were baptized and welcomed into God's Church!

David left and I continued the Prophecy series and launched into a chapter by chapter study of the books of Daniel and Revelation. You can find all audio sermons of both David and I on the following website: www.propheciesrevealingthefuture.com. Together with two other Bible workers, Samuel and Amber, we reached out and visited the people that attended the series. Samuel and Amber recently got married and have committed a year of their lives to work in Christchurch.

The interest has been really great! It is almost like the tragedy has sparked a revival among many. A group of youth from the local university started coming to the meetings and were inspired by what they heard. Together with them we started a Bible group at the university. The students invited their friends and we had up to 30 attentive bright young people attending! A South African couple began coming to the meetings and they were so inspired by what they heard that they shared with another family from the South African church they attended. The family that joined them was so captivated by the Word that they also shared the invitation. It was like a ripple effect moving through this South African congregation.



Biblical truth moves forward like a wild fire. Our prayers are with our new friends as they seek to know the scriptures more fully. Surely the enemy will try to put out these flames but we are confident that the work that has been begun will be completed.

It has been a tremendous blessing to study with dear people all throughout Christchurch from so many different backgrounds. Former Atheists, Catholics, Pentecostals, and even a Hindu young man! They all have one thing in common – A hunger to learn the Word of God. A young man who was an atheist told us how the truth of God's Word had just totally changed his picture of the world around him! A young Philipino couple said the weekly Bible studies in their home had altered the course of their lives and given them a foundation in these shaky times of uncertainty. Another man made the decision to keep the 4th commandment of the Sabbath despite difficulties at his job. He told me that the story of Daniel the prophet in Babylon had given him courage. Daniel had remained faithful when all odds were against him and God blessed him for his faithfulness. Our new friend gained confidence that God would be with him. On our last Sabbath in New Zealand he, together with 4 other precious souls, entered into covenant with Jesus through baptism!

We miss all the new friends we made in Christchurch, but we are confident that they are in good hands. Samuel and Amber, together with Ilam church, are carrying the work forward. We know many of you have been praying for our work in New Zealand and we want to thank you for your concern, messages of encouragement, and above all your prayers. Let me assure you that God has heard them.

The events that led me on a track which geared me toward God started in my late teens. I went through some serious challenges. Taking on several advanced classes in high school, caused me stress which I was not able to cope with. At the same time my mother was diagnosed with cancer. After a brave battle she died. I struggled with guilt. I blamed myself for not taking care of her as I should and not telling her I loved her, which I actually did. At this time my mental state affected my physical wellbeing. I started to loose hair. My mental and physical challenges affected my social life. I would cry for hours – and for the first time in my life I called upon God, even though I was not religious. A classmate approached me about God, and I opened up. In 2009 I accepted Jesus into my life.



A few months later Samuel Riemersma showed up on my door. He asked if I wanted to do Bible-studies. We studied for weeks, and the truths he pointed out from God's Word made sense. Later Daniel Pel came and did a public series of presentations on the prophecies. I enjoyed the presentations, and since he was preaching in the church it gave me a reason to attend the Sabbath programs. In November 2010 I was baptized in the Seventh Day Adventist Church.



The more I know about the Bible and history, the more the Adventist doctrine and the three angles messages of Revelation seems imperative for our day. I have already started doing Bible studies with others, sharing what I have found in God's Word. I thank God for the people He has brought into my life and for His Word.
